## educational programs

At the Museum of Arts and Design (MAD), education programs provide exposure, enrichment, and training in the arts for children, teens, and teachers. Every learning experience is equally important, from a child's first visit to an art museum, and a teen's involvement in afterschool programming, to teachers' participation in professional development.

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## educational tours

### SCHOOL GROUPS

MAD offers several options for visiting school groups. The ninety-minute flagship tour and workshop offers K-12 students an inquiry-led Museum tour and a hands-on workshop designed to engage them in direct observation, discussion, and art making. MAD's sixty-minute tour-only option invites students to spend extended time looking in the galleries and engaging in critical discussion. All tours visit MAD's Artist Studios, where students meet and talk with a practicing artist or designer.
